AHA Pre-Conference Workshop @ NARHA Conference Wednesday, November 14, 2007 Anaheim, CA

Feldenkrais and Hippotherapy Presented by Mary Debono.

The Feldenkrais Method is a body awareness system that therapists and horse people can adapt for their individual sessions and improve their clients or riders experience and enhance their own riding. The Feldenkrais Method is based on body movements that increase an individual's awareness and help improve function. The Feldenkrais teacher guides people through a sequence of movements that are organized around a functional activity, with participants learning how to involve their entire self in the movement. The result is elegant and virtually effortless. It is useful in improving general athletic ability, increasing physical and mental function and enhancing a person's potential for learning.

Workshop participants will gain an experiential and theoretical understanding of Moshe Feldenkrais' Awareness Through Movement lessons that will be chosen specifically for the usefulness to therapists. This is an exciting opportunity to benefit from knowledge that can help the people we work with, our horses and ourselves.

A life-long horse woman, Mary Debono is a Guild Certified Feldenkrais® Practitioner and the creator of the SENSE Method sm. She specializes in helping improve the comfort, athletic ability and freedom of movement of people and animals.

In addition to working with people, Mary has developed Equine SENSE to apply the Feldenkrais principles to horses and their movement. She uses hand-on movements to give the horse the experience of moving in a more harmonious and comfortable way. Then Mary applies these same principles to horse-rider partnerships.

RESEARCH NEWS...

\$1000.00 AHA Research Grant Award

Congratulations to Danielle Champagne OT, the recipient of the \$1000.00 AHA Research Grant for **The Kinematic Evaluation of hippotherapy treatment in Children with Down Syndrome**. The ten week study is almost finished and was supported in part by the University of Quebec. Outcome measures include the Gross Motor Function Measure (GMFM) and videographed kinematic analysis with accelerometers attached to the horse and the study subjects.

\$20,000.00 AHA Research Grant Award

Congratulations to Ruth Dismuke-Blakely MS/CCC-SLP HPCS, the recipient of a one-time AHA Research Grant award of \$20,000.00. Skyline Therapy Services in Edgewood NM and the University of New Mexico Speech and Hearing Sciences Department will investigate **The Impact of Hippotherapy as a Treatment Tool on Functional Communication in Children with Autism Spectrum Disorder.** The study begins November 1, 2007 using videotaped speech/language samples of 36 participants transcribed into Systematic Analysis of Language Transcripts (SALT).
